**AGREEMENT**

The following is a list of specific criteria which must be met by RCC Early Admit students in order to qualify for graduation from Clarkstown North/South:

Students **must** meet with their school counselors in the spring of their junior year to confirm minimum GPA and all graduation requirements prior to applying to the RCC Early Admit Program.

All students are expected to be enrolled as **full time** students at RCC taking 5 courses plus PE for a *minimum* of 14 credits semester 1 and 17 credits semester 2. The 2 credit PE course can be taken either semester 1 or 2, but students **must** be enrolled in PE both semesters. If for any reason a student cannot meet these requirements, the student must see their counselor immediately.

Students **must** return a copy of their RCC course schedule to their school counselor within two days of registering. (This procedure **must** be followed again after semester 2 registration).

Any additions or deletions to the course schedule must be made in advance with permission from the student's school counselor.

Students must provide an official copy of grades for each semester for the school counselor to certify graduation requirements. School counselors have no access to student progress until grades are issued by RCC. *Students who do not successfully pass a graduation requirement in semester one while attending RCC are advised to return to their home high school in semester two, to maximize their chance of graduating on time.*

Students who are taking a course at RCC to satisfy a core course requirement for NCAA Division 1 or 2 eligibility must notify their counselor.

**TO MAKE FOR A SMOOTH SENIOR YEAR PARENTS AND STUDENTS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT:**

All students enrolled at RCC are entitled to participate in all high school activities as they are still considered students in Clarkstown. Read the daily announcements for information regarding senior activities.

It is the **sole** responsibility of the student attending RCC to contact the senior class advisors (North) or the first-floor office (South) with any questions regarding graduation, pictures, cap and gown and other senior related activities and events.

Contact should be made with the student's school counselor on a periodic basis for college applications and/or post high school planning. Information on scholarships and other post-high school opportunities is available on the School Counseling website and Naviance.
